“Breaking with Tradition: Making Federal Grant Aid Work for Today’s Students”
From Mr. Miller’s most recent policy brief: “There is, in short, a mismatch between the students who are increasingly enrolling in higher education and the formulas, structures, systems, and incentives set up to welcome them. The result is a system that all too often sets students up for failure.
