Newcombe Foundation Update – October 2014

For the *Newcombe Scholarships for Mature Women Students* Conference

Student Scholarships and Fellowships (all programs)

- According to institutional reports, 37,274 scholarships totaling \$41,790,875 have been awarded to students as Newcombe Scholarships from 1981-82 through 2013-14 at 99 funded colleges and universities.
- Newcombe Fellowships have been awarded to 1,172 promising graduate students, including twenty-two \$25,000 fellowships in 2014-15.
- **In 2013-14, 1,052 students received Newcombe Scholarships averaging \$2,373.**
- The combined value of ninety-eight Newcombe-endowed scholarship funds at sixty institutions was \$19,168,337, as reported in mid-2014.

Newcombe Scholarships for Mature Women Students

- **In 2011-12, 640 students received scholarships averaging \$2,594, for a total of \$1,660,332.**
- For 2014-15, Newcombe Current Use grants in this program total \$720,500 and Endowment Challenge grants total \$439,833.
- As of 2014-15, **twelve** of thirty-one funded institutions in the program (38.7%) plan to accept Newcombe Scholarship applications from men as well as women.
